

BORJESSONS of SWEDEN

First Generation

1. Borje BÖRJESSION was born 25 Nov 1751 in Kierra-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden and died 30 Jul 1822 in Korsvägen-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.

Borje married **Gunnila JONSDOTTER**, daughter of **Jon JONSSON** and **Catharina GUNNESDOTTER**, 9 Jun 1776 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden. Gunnila was born 11 Dec 1750 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden and died 9 Aug 1807 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.

2. Magnus BÖRJESSION (*Borje*¹) was born 27 Mar 1788 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden and died 11 Dec 1850 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.

Örgryte Parish records: Children Carl and Johanna died of typhoid fever and Maria died of black fever. Magnus died of dysentery and Anna Svensdotter died of chest inflammation (prob pneumonia). Magnus was a Farmhand/Boatman/Innkeeper/Farm Owner/Juryman. Anna Catrina Daglback died of fever.

Magnus married **Anna Catrina DAGLBACK** 11 Jun 1810 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden. Anna was born about 1790 in , , Sweden and died 25 Nov 1814 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.

Children from this marriage were:

- 3 M i. **Gustaf BÖRJESSION** was born 4 Apr 1811 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.
Örgryte Parish records: Moved to America 1831. Not found in USA census records.
- 4 M ii. **Niclas BÖRJESSION** was born 26 Sep 1813 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden and died 27 Apr 1814 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.

Magnus next married **Anna SVENSDOTTER**, daughter of **Sven AHLBOS** and **Brita Maria HANSDOTTER**, 12 Apr 1819 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden. Anna was born 10 Dec 1790 in Kallebäck-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden and died 4 Jan 1870 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.

- 6 F ii. **Anna Catrina BÖRJESSION** was born 2 Mar 1822 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden. She had no known marriage and no known children.
- 7 F iii. **Brita Sofia BÖRJESSION** was born 18 Dec 1823 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden and died 20 Mar 1908 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.
Brita married **Anders OLSSON** 3 Feb 1850 in , , Sweden.
- 8 F iv. **Maria Charlotta BÖRJESSION** was born 16 Sep 1825 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden and died 30 Mar 1840 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden.
- 9 F v. **Emilia Augusta BÖRJESSION** was born 10 Aug 1827 in Stom-Örgryte, G&B, Sweden and died 10 Mar 1869 in Göteborg, G&B, Sweden.

Bpt 19 Aug 1827 Örgryte. Emilia's granddaughter, Elsie Reeck's family history: The court house marriage records call Emilia a "Gotenborg beauty". "When my mother was still an infant, there was a plague in Sweden. My mother told me they called it "rose fever", no doubt like our scarlet fever. Her mother and father both died from it. No record I have has shown me the year that they died, but my mother says she was just a baby. My grandmother, Emilie Augusta Borgesson, had two maiden sisters who lived in Gotenborg, Britta and Hannah. They ran an inn or hostel, whatever they called it in that day. Travel was mostly by horseback or horse and carriage, and they took all the eight orphans into their home, educated them, and brought them up. As I have told you, the boys were musician, jeweler, and florist. The girls were taught homemaking, dress making, and millinery, all kinds of hand work, such as knitting and crocheting. My mother preferred millinery, but she was an excellent cook, dressmaker, and homemaker. See Elsie's story for much more family life.

Emilia married **Carl Ludwig Lorenz GROSS**, son of **Carl Jacob GROSS**, 18 Feb 1855 in Örgryte, G&B, Sweden. Carl was born 6 Jul 1823 in Berlin, Prussia, Germany and died 29 Dec 1889 in Berlin, Berlin, Germany.

Swedish family records: Dec 1854 Kristine Parish, Goteborg City Incoming membership of Carl Ludwig Lorenz Gross, a cloth printer from Berlin. Became Swedish citizen 1856. in Örgryte. "Family came from #35 in 1863."

Elsie (Bailey) Reeck book: Carl Gross was an engineer traveling to many European countries helping to set up new methods of machinery in factories. In the 1850s he came to Goteborg Sweden to set up a new process of machinery called the Piratia printer named after the Frenchman Pirrotin who invented this machine, which was able to print cloth for clothing with three colors in one step; it was developed in 1830. Elsie Reeck's book details pages and pages of our Swedish family history.

17 Feb 2014 I received an email from a cousin in Sweden who found my website, Sune Persson, husband of Elisabeth Ulfstrom. He supplied death date for Emilia Borjesson and families of some of their children, and says "So far in my research I have also found out that Carl Ludvig was married in Germany before he came to Sweden and after the death of Emilia Augusta in 1869, he went back to Germany in 1870 and there was married again in 1871."
